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
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Congratulations! You are taking part in a murder mystery by Red Herring Games.

A few simple instructions to help you along:

Firstly: Don't Panic!

This booklet contains all the information you need as a guest to help you act your part throughout the murder mystery party.

The first page provides you with additional background information to help you get into character, however there are no special acting abilities required and you can make as much or as little of your character as you wish.

After that on each page you are given either something to read out (dialogue), questions to ask, or information to help you answer questions you will be asked. These questions and answers are not intended to be read out word for word. Instead read them, digest the information and then ask and answer any questions in your own words. You are encouraged to ad lib, but it is very important you do not lie, so please provide the information contained within your booklet when asked.

Your host for the evening will direct you where necessary and tell you when to move on to the next round when the time is right.

If you are the murderer you will not be told. When you finally come to guess who did it – it could easily be you and feel free to point the finger at yourself if you feel you must!

And lastly: Have fun!

Background Character Information:

Keep this information to yourself, and use it to help you to act in character throughout the mystery:

You're the one who holds the group together. You're a peacemaker. Make sure everyone has a buddy – uneven numbers upset you.

You are known for your hugs, so make sure to give out a few to those who seem upset. You don't like it when people disagree.

Try and get people to hold hands at the beginning of each round. You like being in charge, so try and sit at the head of the table. Explain that you feel most comfortable sitting where it appears that you are the piece connecting two sides.

You and Fay Den-Powell do not get along.

Introductions:

Use the following dialogue to introduce yourself to the other guests, speaking when indicated below.

Iona Woggle speaks first using the following dialogue:

This is terribly upsetting news! Let me be the first to say that I have no idea who did this to poor Peg Puller, but I'm sure it was an accident. I can't imagine anyone here would want to hurt Peg on purpose. We all know that any problem can be solved by talking. Isn't that true?

After you have heard from everyone, please continue reading and begin round 1.

Scripted Dialogue Round 1

- Fay Den-Powell:** This is a ridiculous waste of time! Why was it necessary to introduce ourselves? We all know each other.
- Iona Woggle:** Now, Fay, I know you don't like it when someone else is in charge, but if you calm down for a moment and think about it, the Patrol Leader had a very good idea. Saying our names was a wise way for us to calm ourselves down and focus.
- Barbie Kew:** Who needs to calm down? I don't. Let's get on with it! I'm ablaze with ideas!
- Iona Woggle:** Good for you, Barbie. I'm sure we're all very interested in hearing them.
- Barbie Kew:** Well, for starters - - -
- Ivanna Sleep:** Not yet, Barbie. Let's take a moment, shall we? I vote for a brief nap before we begin. Who's with me?
- Daisy Chain:** And besides, Barbie, I've always thought of you as a 'mains' girl, not a starter! Now, I don't think napping would be a very good idea – sorry Ivanna – but a few moments of silence for poor Peg might be appropriate.
- Gail Warnin:** Poor Peg? What an odd way to describe her!
- Daisy Chain:** Why do you think that?
- Fay Den-Powell:** I can answer that easily! Anyone who was as free with her opinions as Peg Puller was wasn't poor in spirit. No, no. She was a true piece of work.
- Ivanna Sleep:** How long is all of this going to take? Do we get regularly scheduled breaks?

Fay Den-Powell: I'll see what I can do, Ivanna.

Ivanna Sleep: Thanks Fay. You're the best!

Barbie Kew: And here we go again, everyone. The 'Powell Pedestal' just grew a wee bit higher. You certainly are worshiped by some, Fay!

Daisy Chain: I still can't believe that one of us would kill Peg Puller. She was a doll.

Barbie Kew: A voodoo doll, maybe.

Iona Woggle: I thought we had a good troop here. I thought everyone had each other's best interests at heart.

Barbie Kew: Ha! The cold truth is that everyone has their own interests at heart.

Iona Woggle: Do you really believe that?

Barbie Kew: I'm not saying whether I do or whether I don't. Why should I trust you? There's been a murder!

Ivanna Sleep: I'm not really comfortable thinking about what everyone was thinking about earlier today. How could it be my business? I don't want people knowing my thoughts.

Fay Den-Powell: I don't think we need to know your thoughts, Ivanna, but we'll need to know your movements! I know. I watch Sherlock.

Gail Warnin: And that makes you an expert, does it?

Iona Woggle: Oh stop it, everyone! Let's remember why we're here. Poor Peg has pegged it. Who's done it? That's all that's important now.

Iona Woggle - First Round

Questions you should ask:

Did Ivanna Sleep consider Peg Puller a mate?

Who does Daisy Chain consider to be her best mate?

Information you should reveal about yourself only when asked.

You knew Peg Puller very well. Unfortunately, Peg was a bit of a rabble-rouser. You had had to act as a peacemaker between Peg and the other girls quite a few times. Although you'd tried to get Peg to see other people's points of view, you're sorry to say you weren't very successful.

Yes, you did. You saw Peg Puller and Barbie Kew having a scuffle over a piece of paper. You don't know what it was about.

Do not read further until instructed by your host.

Scripted Dialogue Round 2

- Fay Den-Powell:** Did I hear Patrol Leader Kit Complete correctly? Did she just say that Peg Puller was strangled with her Guide neckerchief?
- Daisy Chain:** That's what she said.
- Fay Den-Powell:** Who would ever disgrace the Guide neckerchief by doing that? It's appalling!
- Ivanna Sleep:** Isn't the fact that Peg was murdered appalling enough?
- Iona Woggle:** That's a good point, Ivanna. Thank you.
- Barbie Kew:** Do you think someone used the neckerchief on purpose, just to make a point?
- Gail Warnin:** I think the point's been made.
- Barbie Kew:** No, I mean that the murderer used the neckerchief because they hated the Guides.
- Fay Den-Powell:** Who could hate the Guides?!
- Gail Warnin:** It could have been used by someone who loves the Guides but wants to throw us off her path. Like when all the forecasts say we're going to have sunny weather but the rain blows in. People can be as unpredictable as the weather.
- Ivanna Sleep:** I'm confused. Is this a murder investigation or a weather forecast?
- Fay Den-Powell:** Let's concentrate on this particular mystery right now, shall we?

- Barbie Kew:** I've been saying forever that those scarves were dangerous. I meant dangerous to anyone's fashion sense, of course! They're hideous! Has anyone ever investigated having Hermes designing a neckerchief for the Guides?
- Iona Woggle:** I don't think the Guiding organisation would agree to that. Hermes is a French designer.
- Daisy Chain:** The Queen wears Hermes scarves. You can't be more British than Her Majesty!
- Fay Den-Powell:** I'd rather not have the Queen brought into our discussion, if you don't mind.
- Barbie Kew:** Maybe Peg just tied her neckerchief too tight and strangled herself.
- Ivanna Sleep:** Now there's a happy thought!
- Iona Woggle:** I don't think that's possible. How could anyone strangle themselves?
- Ivanna Sleep:** Peg might have managed it. She was a very determined person.
- Daisy Chain:** That's true. Once she made her mind up, that was it. It was impossible to change it. I've heard Iona try more than once.
- Gail Warnin:** Do you really think she could have done it to herself?
- Iona Woggle:** She did have a very strong character.
- Fay Den-Powell:** But not a strong enough neck, apparently!

Iona Woggle - Second Round

Questions you should ask:

When did Daisy Chain see the wildflowers that only bloom once every 25 years?

Who rang the dinner gong? Ask Barbie Kew.

Information you should reveal about yourself only when asked.

You had a rather loud disagreement with Peg Puller last night. You'd heard a rumour that Peg was going to the Group Leader to request that the Griffin troop be split up. You were horrified! You tried your best to change her mind.

You last saw her when you went into the tent you shared late this afternoon. You don't know exactly what time it was.

Do not read further until instructed by your host.

Scripted Dialogue Round 3

- Ivanna Sleep:** I want it to be time to name names!
- Gail Warnin:** Why?
- Ivanna Sleep:** Because I want this to be over. I need a sleep!
- Iona Woggle:** I'm not prepared to make a final decision yet.
- Fay Den-Powell:** Nor am I. A good Guide always knows when they're prepared.
- Iona Woggle:** Thank you for your support, Fay.
- Fay Den-Powell:** You're welcome. We Den-Powells have guiding in our blood.
- Barbie Kew:** And let's stop right there, please. I don't think any of us want another lecture on your ancestors.
- Daisy Chain:** We've got bigger weeds to pull.
- Barbie Kew:** Don't you mean fish to fry?
- Daisy Chain:** Please don't mention frying innocent fish. There's been enough killing today.
- Gail Warnin:** Oh good grief!
- Barbie Kew:** Goodness has nothing to do with it.
- Fay Den-Powell:** Well I think I know who it is...but I'm not telling.

Cont.

Gail Warnin: You're just showing off. You don't really know.

Barbie Kew: She isn't. And you're the one who usually likes to show off.

Iona Woggle: Please, please! Let's not fight among ourselves.

Barbie Kew: Why not? We seem rather good at it.

Fay Den-Powell: A common experience like this one is showing off all our true colours. Some of us aren't so pretty, are we?

Iona Woggle: Speak for yourself! I think we're all good people.

Gail Warnin: Except for one bad apple.

Barbie Kew: Which is full of worms.

Ivanna Sleep: Ewww! Was that absolutely necessary?

Daisy Chain: You're making me feel rather ill as well. Can't we just get on with this?

Gail Warnin: What a good idea!

Iona Woggle: I'll be glad to see the back of this whole situation, I don't mind telling you.

Barbie Kew: Personally, I'll be glad to see the back of whoever it is who did it. I'll be cheering when she gets led away!

Iona Woggle - Third Round

Questions you should ask:

Fay Den-Powell said she was cleaning up litter around the camp today. Did she see anything unusual while she was cleaning up?

What was in the envelope Daisy Chain gave Ivanna Sleep at breakfast this morning?

Information you should reveal about yourself only when asked.

Not at first. You did try again today.

You're sad to admit it, but yes, you do think that Peg Puller had enemies here in the troop. As much as you want everyone to get along, sometimes it just doesn't happen. Some people, like Daisy Chain for instance, feel things very deeply. You're sure Daisy would do anything for her own cause.

Do not read further until instructed by your host.

Concluding Statement

Use the following dialogue to summarise your position, speaking when indicated below.

Iona Woggle speaks after Fay Den-Powell using the following dialogue:

I do hope that we can come together after all this is over. I'm sure we'll be a stronger, more unified troop because of this tragedy. I knew Peg Puller's idea of splitting up the Griffin troop was wrong. I mean, how could it not be? But I was sad, not mad. Talking about such things is always the answer. Of course, some people are harder to reach than others.

After you have heard from all the guests make a prediction as to who the murderer is and why.

Tell the others.

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
