
Make sure you listen to everyone else's questions and answers.

Doug Baron- Hardnose

Background Character Information

Keep this information to yourself, and use it to help you to act in character throughout the mystery:

You are the judge that people love to hate, being frequently booed for your unsentimental comments and low marks. However, you do appreciate fab-u-lous dancing too, especially anything modern and theatrical.

Away from your professional judging persona, you are not as mean as everyone thinks. Apart from dance you also enjoy fine music and food.

Doug Baron- Hardnose - Introductions

Use the following dialogue to introduce yourself to the other guests, speaking when indicated below.

Doug Baron- Hardnose speaks after Marcy Ballet using the following dialogue:

Mmm, not too shocking, darling. I've seen worse. Quentin Wilson's cha cha cha for one. I think you all know who I am. Doug Baron-Hardnose, choreographer and judge. Ta ta for now!

After you have heard from everyone, please continue reading and begin round 1.

Scripted Dialogue - Round 1

Clara Wonderwoman Ruby's dead!

Angel de Flores Gosh! What a loss! You two were so great

together. I really thought you were going to win

again this year, Colin.

Doug Baron-Hardnose Let's just agree that she was a beautiful dancer.

Angel de Flores She showed so much promise. I think she might

have struggled with her gauchos on the tango

though.

Doug Baron-Hardnose Darling! Gauchos? You must mean the *Argentine*

tango!

Angel de Flores Yes of course. How silly of me.

Marcy Ballet I'm sure she would have gone on to do great

things.

Colin from Scunthorpe Thank you, Marcy.

Drew Marsh What I liked about her was that every week she

went out there and gave 150% effort. That's

even more than I do!

Marcy Ballet Yah, but like, wow! She really surprised me by

dying like that. She was always so good at taking on board comments from the judges, but no one

suggested she'd get murdered.

Doug Baron-Hardnose I have to agree with my fellow judges here. It's a

great loss. Almost as sad as when...

Angel de Flores ... I didn't win the last series. Or the one before.

It's a tragedy really.

Drew Marsh I heard that she was killed by a piano falling on

her head.

Doug Baron-Hardnose No, no, she was just exhausted.

Colin from Scunthorpe She'd been working too hard in training. It's my

fault really. I'm lit-erally lost for words.

Clara Wonderwoman Thanks, everyone. Now let's get on with the

show.

Doug Baron- Hardnose - First Round

Questions you should ask:

Marcy Ballet, did Ruby Rada's grace remind you of yourself?

Drew Marsh, what can you tell us about the music that was planned for tonight's show?

Answers you should give when asked the right questions.

When asked: Doug, how do you feel when you get booed by the audience while you're judging?

Say: Oh, I really don't mind getting booed by the audience. It's all part of the theatre, and I'll always be a performer at heart. Did anyone here see my unique take on the wicked stepmother in the Cinderella last panto season? Many said it was the definitive performance of one of the stage's greatest and most iconic roles.

When asked: Doug Baron-Hardnose, have you heard the rumours concerning a new judging panel for next season?

Say: I have to admit I have heard a whisper of a rumour about new judges for next season, but I can't imagine anyone would ever think of replacing me!

Do not read further until instructed by your host.

Scripted Dialogue - Round 2

Marcy Ballet Sooo! She was poisoned!

Drew Marsh Poison? Why would anyone want to drink that?

Isn't it...

Doug Baron-Hardnose ...poisonous? I'm not sure they drank it

deliberately though.

Drew Marsh Maybe someone was upset that she was in the

competition. Some might say she shouldn't have been allowed to perform because she was so

good.

Marcy Ballet Indeed. Did you see her waltz in the very first

week? She reminded me of me sometimes.

Drew Marsh Didn't that bother anyone? I mean, she did have

quite a lot of dancing background.

Colin from Scunthorpe I had no idea that Ruby had dance school training.

In fact, I didn't think anyone knew that.

Angel de Flores Except for Ruby, obviously. She would know as it

happened to her.

Drew Marsh You know what I heard? Three years of dance

school.

Clara Wonderwoman I heard it was the Curse of Seriously that killed

her.

Drew Marsh The Curse of Seriously? What's that? Something

about Halloween?

Doug Baron-Hardnose Oh no, darling. You've got that all mixed up. I

believe the Curse of Seriously refers to something

else entirely.

Angel de Flores I am the one that is cursed. When will I ever win

this show? Is my dancing not beautiful?

Doug Baron-Hardnose Magnificent, darling.

Clara Wonderwoman But we still don't know who killed Ruby Rada! At

least, I don't.

Doug Baron- Hardnose - Second Round

Questions you should ask:

Clara Wonderwoman, what was that rather awkward conversation you had with Ruby Rada about?

Colin, can you explain what happened to Ruby Rada last week during training?

Answers you should give when asked the right questions.

When asked: Doug, when did you meet with Ruby Rada today?

Say: I met with Ruby Rada twice today. The first time was at the judges' briefing, where I remember she was drinking some sort of healthy green juice as she'd just come from the canteen. Ruby was always swigging that stuff - dis-gust-ing! I saw her again later in hair and make-up. Apparently, it was the second time that she'd been in.

When asked: Doug Baron-Hardnose, are you as mean to the other judges as you are to the contestants?

Say: I'm always nice to the other judges, mainly because they're all fabulous! Did you know that Marcy and I go way back? We were often at the same parties in London in the 90s back when she was a prima ballerina and I was performing in the West End.

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Scripted Dialogue - Round 3

Colin from Scunthorpe I think I'm still in shock. Ruby should be here with

me right now.

Angel de Flores I suppose that means the competition is wide

open now.

Doug Baron-Hardnose Yes. Anyone could win.

Angel de Flores I'm just so glad Ruby's feeling better.

Drew Marsh Better? I thought she was dead!

Angel de Flores No! I mean I'm glad she was feeling better after

her injury last week.

Colin from Scunthorpe Yes, she was looking quite good out there tonight.

Until she wasn't, of course.

Marcy Ballet It was a spider that got her, wasn't it? Nasty little

things. That's why I never work with children or

animals.

Colin from Scunthorpe You should add dancers to that list. Never work

with children, animals or dancers. A tough lot to

get along with.

Angel de Flores And what do you mean by that?

Clara Wonderwoman He doesn't mean anything I'm sure. We all loved

it. Let's see what the judges make of it. Marcy.

Marcy Ballet She was nearly as graceful as... well, me! When

she moved her arms like this, and her feet like this, I think she really is one of the best we've

ever had.

Doug Baron-Hardnose And you can boo me if you like, but let's not get

too worried about who earns what. We're all

well paid for what we do.

Marcy Ballet Easy for you to say.

Drew Marsh I'd be happy to get paid at all. But Miss Ballet, is

your salary complaint perhaps the reason you were looking to make a little extra, if you know

what I mean?

Marcy Ballet Ah! I'm sure I don't know what you're talking

about.

Drew Marsh I'll tell you one thing. I certainly won't be wasting

my texts voting for Ruby again.

Clara Wonderwoman Nor me! Er, not that I vote of course. That would

be highly unethical.

Colin from Scunthorpe Makes me think though. After losing Ruby, I

wonder if anyone else going to be eliminated this

week?

Clara Wonderwoman Eliminated?

Drew Marsh Sorry. Unfortunate choice of words...

Doug Baron- Hardnose - Third Round

Questions you should ask:

Marcy Ballet, please don't take offense, but has your judging always been honest?

Drew Marsh, do you know anything about missing jewellery?

Answers you should give when asked the right questions.

When asked: Doug Baron-Hardnose, would you say that you're happy with your salary?

Say: I'm very happy with my salary, darling. Why wouldn't I be? Of course, money means nothing to me, but it's nice to be valued.

When asked: Doug, where were you at the time of the murder?

Say: I was with the other judges at the time of the murder so I can't have done it. Much as I'm sure you'd all love to, you can't cast me as the murderer - sorry, darlings!

Do not read further until instructed by your host.

Doug Baron- Hardnose - Concluding Statement

Use the following dialogue to summarise your position, speaking when indicated below.

Doug Baron-Hardnose speaks after Clara Wonderwoman using the following dialogue:

Darling, you're too hard on yourself! You play a vital role in the show. And can I say you look quite fab-u-lous tonight. That visit to the costume department earlier has done wonders for you. I for one am convinced of your innocence.

After you have heard from all the guests make a prediction as to who the murderer is and why.

Tell the others.

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
